

# Pastor's Page



A verse from Proverbs says, "Surely you have a future, and your hope will not be cut off." Please hold onto this promise. Believe that God is still writing the story and history of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Freeport, PA.

But I also share this ancient prayer with you: "Lord, you have called us to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, to paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we are going, but only that you hand is leading us and your love supporting us". Amen.

This is faith, whether for the journey of an individual dealing with cancer or a congregation doing what it must to support pastoral ministry. The Book of Hebrews puts it this way: "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not yet seen."

It seems clear that the financial resources are not there at this time for the congregation to think of supporting a full-time pastor on its own. Knowing of the strength and vitality that this congregation once had, this can be a discouraging reality to accept. But this is precisely why the church family must hold onto the promise of God and the gift of hope. Your willingness to trust God and your willingness to remain committed are vital.

Perhaps God has brought me to this place and time for a reason. I started my first call to ministry by bringing the two Lutheran congregations in town together in a shared ministry. I ended my ministry in Zelienople by serving both congregations in town for over five years.

Moving forward, I would suggest that the congregation take advantage of my presence by trying to get a feel for what a shared ministry with another congregation looks like. To use a proverbial saying, "Let's kick the tires before thinking about buying the car." Let's check it out before making a final decision.

I have been talking with Barbara Ravenstahl who serves Faith Lutheran Church in Natrona Heights as a lay person. She is a "Synodically Authorized Minister" who functions in every capacity as a pastor but who is not ordained. Unfortunately the ELCA no longer supports this kind of ministry. But she has served her congregation faithfully for many years on a part-time basis. She has been their hope, but now at the age of 77, she is ready to step back.

As Lent approaches, it might provide an opportunity to see what shared ministry looks like. If I was the sole pastor of these two congregations, I would wear myself out trying to do two Maundy Thursday Services and two Good Friday services between the two congregations. So each congregation could host one of the services and invite the other congregation to come. This would be a chance to "kick the tires."

The Season of Lent is fast approaching (March) but there is time to think about it. Share your thoughts and feelings with me, with members of Church Council, with one another. It is a path as yet untrodden for this wonderful congregation. But can you and I have faith, the commitment to believe in the strength of our faith, to hold onto the gift of hope, and to know that God's hand is leading us and God's love is supporting us? Let me know what you think.

**NEXT CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING Tuesday, February 12, 2019 @ 7 PM** 

Good Morning. The bulk of this letter is about confirmation for our youth. Even if you are not "in the market" for confirmation, I encourage you to read on!

There is hope in this letter for our youth and our whole congregation. And who couldn't use a bit of hope on a cold Tuesday morning in January??

In September of 2018, I started my first term on church council at Trinity. I was late to my first meeting, and in my absence, I was appointed head of Christian Education! It has been a good fit for me, and I have enjoyed revamping the Sunday School hour, and starting some fun activities for both children and adults. If you haven't been to Sunday School recently, I invite you to come see what's new.

The most common question I have gotten since taking on this role has been "What about confirmation?!" To those of you who asked many months ago, I apologize for the delay. But I think I finally have some answers.

In the past, the education requirement for confirmation was a three-year commitment. In addition to regular Sunday School attendance, there were three meeting per school year required after church. These meetings were to facilitate the understanding of Luther's Small Catechism. It was also the tradition of Trinity to confirm in the spring of 9<sup>th</sup> grade. At council meetings, I learned that the ELCA governing body has no regulations on when youth can be confirmed, nor does it dictate a particular curriculum for preparation. These are individual congregation decisions.

As of January, we are enjoying new leadership with Pastor Bob. As our long term interim pastor, he is committed to working with our youth. We want to catch up with anyone we may have missed during our recent leadership changes. Pastor and I had a meeting about Confirmation, below is a summary of our discussion.

- Being new to the congregation, Pastor Bob is coming into the situation with no knowledge of what has or has not taken place in the past.
- Pastor Bob feels that three years may be a long time wait for confirmation, especially for those youth who may have in a sense been left behind. If the child feels ready to make the commitment to the church, and is of a reasonable age, he will work to make that happen. Normally confirmation takes place in Lutheran Churches between 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade. But if older youth want the experience of being confirmed in their faith, Pastor Bob will work with them.
- Pastor Bob wants to meet the youth of our congregation <u>wherever they are</u> in their faith journey, and give them a positive tie to the church. He would like to meet with individual families or small groups to move forward with the process and coordinate dates for confirmation when appropriate.
- Pastor Bob recognizes that youth and families are busy. Youth activities and involvement in the life of the church (like acolyting) are important elements as well. Scheduling "confirmation classes" and requiring attendance is always a challenge. It is hard to teach the faith by building on a series of classes when other important school and community activities conflict.
- Pastor Bob recognizes that family involvement in the process, including the educational element, is important.
- Pastor Bob tries to get the youth to pick a focus or theme either alone or as a group, something that ties the experience together in a memorable way. Examples are a Bible story, making a clay pot to know that one is a vessel of God, or learning about an "Ebenezer Stone" as a reminder that God is our helper in life.
- Pastor Bob stresses that the academic side of things is very important. The youth should be exposed to and demonstrate an understanding of the Bible, Luther's Small Catechism, faith, and the life of the church. But there may be other ways accomplish this without three years of weekly meetings. The main question now is how to make this work for the youth, the families, and this congregation. Together we can work on this.

I am very excited to move forward with this, as my own son, Blair, is of age to be confirmed. We made a list of youth who are of reasonable age, and we could think of about 15 who could be confirmed this spring. What a blessing that would be for Trinity, and all the families involved! 
